A message from the SIL President and General Secretary-Treasurer

31 January 2017

Dear SIL members,

This time we have some major, hot off-the-press news for you: SIL has a new publisher! Starting January 2017, **Taylor & Francis will be publishing** *Inland Waters* and SIL news. The advantages of this change are: (1) SIL members will be exempt from page charges when publishing in *Inland Waters* (whereas non-members will be charged).

(2) Manuscripts to Inland Waters will now be handled through *Editorial Manager*, a user-friendly on-line manuscript processing software, replacing the system used until now.

(3) Being published by a major commercial publisher means that *Inland Waters* will now have a much wider distribution with over 2000 additional libraries. This larger audience will contribute to improving the journal's visibility and impact.

(4) Here comes a most important benefit: All volumes of the former SIL Proceedings, **the** *Verhandlungen* **and the** *Mitteilungen* **will be digitized** in a searchable format. Within a few months these huge but currently mostly

inaccessible volumes will become available on-line for free viewing and downloading to all SIL members. This immense database of knowledge, starting with Volume 1 of the Proceedings published in 1922, will soon be available to all of us, with easy sorting by author or title. Non-members will be charged for this access.

To accommodate these major changes SIL had to revise the criteria for who is a SIL member. While in the past you would continue to be a member if you didn't pay dues for up to 3 years, this will not be possible in the future. From now on, only those who pay their annual dues will be considered members that are eligible for the above benefits. It is therefore time to pay your dues for 2017, either through your National Representative, to the SIL Office, or directly on the SIL website.

Note also that the next 2 months is the last chance for students from developed countries to enjoy the 5 USD/year membership dues rate. From 1 April, student members from developed countries will be charged 10 USD/year. The annual dues for students from developing countries will remain 5 USD/year. All will have to pay for 3 years at once still. So, do encourage students at your vicinity to become SIL member NOW!!

In May 2016 we lost our previous president, Brian Moss, who died at 72 after fighting an aggressive liver cancer. Only a few months earlier, in February Brian was still convinced he would participate at the Congress in Torino. In April, when he realized he would not be able to fly to Torino, he wrote a remarkable letter to SIL members, giving his philosophical perspective on life and death. This letter was published in the June 2016 issue of SIL news. Unfortunately, this issue was published only after Brian was no longer with us. He left behind a new edition of his textbook 'Ecology of Freshwater' to appear shortly, and a legacy for SIL members to remember and follow.

The XXXIII SIL Congress in Torino (31 July – 5 August 2016) was a major success in several ways. The scientific program was diverse, of particularly high standard, and engaging. The number of participants, 816 from 58 countries, was substantially larger than in the Budapest 2013 and Cape-Town 2010 SIL Congresses, both with around 500 participants. But more importantly, 36 % of the participants were students and early career professionals, which is a much larger percentage than that in the previous two Congresses. This success is attributed to several factors, including substantially low registration fees for students and post-docs (only 150 Euro), a large number of students (26) receiving financial support from the Wetzel fund, the International Student Best Paper Competition that attracted many students, the convenient location in Northern Italy, and hopefully, not less important, a growing understanding that SIL Congresses do have a lot to contribute to younger limnologists. We all owe Roberto Bertoni, Christiana Callieri and Luigi Naselli-Flores, a great thank you for organizing this congress.

SIL members have elected two student representatives who joined the SIL Executive Committee in Torino. This is a first time for SIL.

Lastly, decisions were made at the Torino meeting regarding future SIL Congresses. Until now, there was no financial association between the local organizing committees of SIL Congresses and the Society, simultaneously imposing a heavy burden of financial responsibility on the organizers and depriving the Society of much needed income. Given the changing landscape of scientific associations and congresses, the SIL board has agreed to develop, for all future congresses, a financial relationship of mutual benefits between the Society and its congress organizers.



SIL STUDENT COMPETITION 2016

In 2015 SIL announced the first ever SIL International Student Competition, in which the best paper coming out of a thesis would be chosen. At the onset of 2016 the competition was already at an advanced stage: by then, each country has submitted its 1 or 2 representatives to participate in the second and final, international stage of the competition. An international selection committee, made of 7 highly experienced editors-in-chief of limnological journals, chose Jeremy Piggot as the winner of the first place. Francisco Acosta Espinoza and Richard Zamor shared second place, Paulina Salmi and Cedric Morana shared third place. The results were posted in SIL's website and Facebook page, and again in the Congress in Torino.

Based on the success of this competition, a second such competition will be announced in the near future, with its winner presenting at the 2018 SIL Congress in China.

This journal replaces the SIL Proceedings (Verhandlungen), but will remain as faithful as possible to the niche that SIL occupies, with encouragement of a worldwide set of authors and short (except for papers arising from named and plenary talks at Congresses), rapidly published papers. The scope of the journal includes all aspects of physical, chemical, and biological limnology, as well as applied and regional limnology.
